### **NEIGHBORHOOD BILL OF RIGHTS NOTIFICATION**

**August 6, 2010** – You have received this NOTICE because you are the designated representative for a registered Association under the Neighborhood Bill of Rights Ordinance (No. 2007-01). Details regarding a St. Johns County project scheduled for your area have been provided below. Please be advised, umbrella associations are provided notice as a courtesy and do not share the same rights afforded to Neighborhood Associations as defined by the Neighborhood Bill of Rights Ordinance.

**Project Name:** Corona Road Weir

**Project Location:** Northwest Region – Corona Road

**Project Description:** The purpose of this project is to eliminate the increased safety issues and continuing maintenance problems in this area of the roadway right-of-way between Ponte Vedra Blvd. and Rutile Dr. This project will eliminate structural deficiencies which lead to recurring pot holes and tripping hazards for pedestrians, bicycles and vehicles between the roadway and sidewalk. This will also improve the clear zone and drop off conditions along the roadway corridor.

Construction will include replacing downstream end wall, replacing fence, railing and sidewalks, as well as safety improvements by increasing the sidewalk setback to increase clear zone between the sidewalks and roadway.

County staff is required to document all commitments or agreements made during such meetings.
