### **NEIGHBORHOOD BILL OF RIGHTS NOTIFICATION**

**April 13, 2010** – You have received this NOTICE because you are the designated representative for a registered Association under the Neighborhood Bill of Rights Ordinance (No. 2007-01). Details regarding a St. Johns County project scheduled for your area have been provided below. Please be advised, umbrella associations are provided notice as a courtesy and do not share the same rights afforded to Neighborhood Associations as defined by the Neighborhood Bill of Rights Ordinance.

**Project Name:** 10-084 Teco Peoples Gas

**Project Location:** Ponte Vedra Blvd

**Project Description:** Construction of a 4” plastic natural gas main along Corona Rd. from SR A1A going east to the intersection with Ponte Vedra Blvd., then north along Ponte Vedra Blvd. to the St. Johns/Duval County line. There are a total of three distribution lines that run off of Ponte Vedra Blvd. The first is a 2” plastic natural gas distribution line from Ponte Vedra Blvd. onto Pablo Road. The second is a 2” plastic natural gas distribution line from Ponte Vedra Blvd. onto Miranda Rd. The third line is a 4” plastic natural gas distribution line on Ponte Vedra Blvd. extending approximately 928 lf. south of the intersection of Ponte Vera Blvd and Corona Rd.

**NOTICE OF PROJECT MEETING:** The Neighborhood Bill of Rights Ordinance affords registered Neighborhood Associations the right to request a meeting, for the purpose of discussion and coordination with County staff on upcoming projects.
