NPVBC - North Ponte Vedra Beach Coalition: Citizens Group representing Marsh Landing HOA, Marsh Landing Business Association and Ponte Vedra Lakes HOA in discussing issues surrounding the area of Butler Blvd and A1A

FDOT - Florida Department Of Transportation: Agency responsible for Florida State Highways (A1A)

NFTPO - North Florida Transportation Planning Organization: Responsible for planning, funding and mobilizing resources to develop and maintain our transportation system in Clay, Duval, Nassau & St Johns Counties
